1. FROM THE RESEARCH FRONT RICH GROUND OF DECAPTERIDS, BIGEYE SCAD AND UPENOIDS RESOURCES LOCATED OFF KARAIKAL.

MFV Samudrika attached to Chennai Base of Fishery Survey of India recorded rich ground of demersal fish resources off Karaikal. During March, 2015 the vessel caught 500 kg of fish in a single haul. The catch composed of 200 kg Bigeye scad Selar crumenophthalmus (Bloch,1793), 150 kg Indian scad Decaptereus russelli (Ruppel, 1830) and 150 kg Goldband goatfish Upeneus mollucensis (Bleeker, 1855). These resources were recorded from the area Latitude 10°54.1'N/Longitude 80°03.5'E (off Karaikal) at a depth of



49 m. Specimens of Indian scad, Big eye scad and gold band goatfish in the length range of 14.5-19.5cm, 20-28cm and 13-19cm respectively. Observation on gonads revealed that all the specimens of three species were in

Occurrence of Juveniles of Indo-pacific sailfish *Istiophorus platypterus* (Shaw, 1792) in western part of Andaman Sea.

MFV Blue Marlin belonging to the Port Blair Base of Fishery Survey of India recorded occurrence of juveniles of Indo-pacific sailfish Istiophorus platypterus (Shaw, 1792) from western part of Andaman Sea. A group of 10 to 15 juveniles of Sailfish were drifting on the surface of water of area Latitude 2°58.0'N and Longitude 91°58.0'E at the depth of 2835 m., during night hours on 25 March 2015. One

juvenile sailfish was captured by scoop net. The total length of the specimen was 10 cm. Morphometric analysis revealed that the specimen had 48 first and 7 second dorsal rays. The anal had 11 rays in the anterior portion and 7 rays in the posterior portion with 5 detached rays in between which are not discernible in the adult. The colour was uniformly dark along the dorsal side becoming lighter laterally. The ventral side was white. The jaws were black in colour. The dorsal fin was black and the characteristic blotches found on the fin of the adult fish were visible only in a few places. The previous record of juvenile sailfish from Indian Ocean waters is an early juvenile of 12.7 cm long reported from the coast off Ceylon. The first juvenile of Sailfish caught from Lakshadweep Sea was nearly 43.2 cm.

IV. ANNUAL ROSA MEETING HELD AT MORMUGAO BASE OF FSI

Annual review of quantitative and qualitative performance of the survey vessels and scientific activities carried out by the Bases was held at Fishery Survey of India, Mormugao during 24-25 March. Shri Premchand, Director General(i/c), FSI chaired the meeting. Meeting decided to overcome the lacunae in implementation of proposed programme by proper planning at the Head quarter and Base level. Meeting finalized the draft fishery survey programme 2015-16 and decided to effectively implement the programme with scientific orientation and strategic management. An indepth discussion on the existing fleet strength and need to replace the old vessels of the Institute was are held during the meeting. The members opined that new vessels are required for effective implementation of the resource survey programme and to address the future research needs of the Institute. Hence, decided to submit a proposal for purchasing seven new vessels for the Institute.

V. SIXTEENTH CONSULTATIVE COMMITTEE MEETING AT FSI HQ

The sixteenth meeting of the Consultative Committee of Fishery Survey of India (HQ) was held on 30 March 2015 at the FSI HQ Mumbai. Shri Premchand, Director General(IC), FSI chaired the meeting. He presented the gist of the activities of the Institute during 2014-15. Delay in getting drydocking slots in the shipyards, prolonged dry docking repairs, shortage of certified hands LSA/FFA survey etc. were cited as the major reasons that affected the performance of survey

vessel. Meeting reviewed the action taken to implement the recommendations made in the fifteenth meeting of the Consultative Committee, performance of the survey vessels during the previous year (2014-2015), extension activities of the Institute, performance of marine engineering division and the progress of the existing research projects. The Consultative Committee approved the proposed Fishery Resources Survey, Assessment and Research Programme 2015-16 of the Institute and agreed upon the decision of FSI to submit proposal for acquiring new resource servey vessels to enhance its fleet strength.
