#### FROM THE RESEARCH FRONT

### Metazoan parasites of *Alepisaurus ferox* and *Xiphias gladius* of the eastern Arabian Sea

The documentation of fish parasites is important in describing the biodiversity of a given water body. Scientists of Cochin Base of FSI have studied the metazoan parasites of long snouted Lancetfish (Alepisaurus ferox) and Swordfish (Xiphias gladius) of the eastern Arabian Sea for the first time. Three Cestodes (Pelichnibothrium speciosum, Tentacularia coryphaenae and Hepatoxylon trichiuri) and one Trematode (Botulus microporus) were collected from the lancetfish. Parasite prevalence was 98.04 % and the average intensity was 9.58. In the swordfish, all the samples were infected, and the average parasite intensity was 51.4. Five Cestodes (Hepatoxylon trichiuri, Fistulicola plicatus, Nybelinia bisulcata, Nybelinia lingualis and Tentacularia coryphaenae), two species of nematodes (Hysterothylacium incurvum and unidentified nematodes), one species of copepode (Pennella instructa), and a trematode (Hirudinella ventricosa) were collected from the swordfish. The results of the study is published in the journal "Marine Biodiversity" (publisher: Springer, DOI:10.1007/s12526-015-0346-4).

## Occurrence of Shortfin Mako Shark (*Isurus oxyrinchus*), Rafinesque, 1810 in the Nicobar Waters

The Shortfin Mako Shark (Isurus oxyrinchus) was caught onboard the vessel MFV Blue Marlin attached to Port Blair Base of Fishery Survey of India on 22 September 2015 in the area 09°N/93°E at a depth of 2092 m. The species caught was measured about 241 cm TL and weight upto 12 kg. The Shortfin Mako Shark also known as Blue Pointer are the largest Mackerel Sharks belonging to the family of Laminidae. The term 'Mako' comes from the Maori language meaning either the shark or shark tooth. Shortfin Mako Sharks are fairly large species with a fusiform, cylindrical, moderately slender body with a vertically elongated tail assisting its lifestyle. In addition, it has long and acutely pointed snout. Colour is brilliant metallic blue dorsally and white ventrally. The line of demarcation between blue and white on the body is distinct. The Shortfin Maco Shark inhabits offshore temperate and tropical seas worldwide. It is a pelagic species confining itself to surface waters. It is known to be an endothermic shark preferring temperature above 16°c.

Thus species serves as an important species for longline fisheries due to its economic importance like high quality meat for consumption and oil which is extracted from its liver while the jaws and teeth are used in ornaments.

### Occurrence of juvenile in North-west coast of India (Lat 18°N to 20°N)

The vessel *Matsya Nireekshani* attached to Mumbai Base of Fishery Survey of India recorded the occurrence of juveniles of most of the fishes from North–west cost of India during December 2015. Juveniles of *Arius* spp. (Cat fish),

Loligo duvaucelli (squid), Nemipterus japonicus (Rani fish), Epinephelus diacanthus (Kalava), Rastrelliger kanagurta (Mackerel), Megalaspis cordyla (Horse mackerel) were observed during the cruise. These species were recorded from the area Lat 18°00.4'N/Long 72°28.9'E at a depth range of 30-50 m. The length range of Rani fish (7.0-21.5 cm), Arius tenuispinis (17.5-47.0 cm), Epinephelus diacanthus (11.0-18.0 cm), Loligo duvaucelli (8.0-22.0 cm), Rastrelliger



kanagurta (12.0-27.5 cm) and M e g a l a s p i s cordyla (18.0-33.0 cm) were recorded. Length frequency studies revealed that all the specimen were in Juvenile stage.

### **Bumper catch in Longline fishery**

The vessel *Matsya Vrushti* recorded a better hooking rate during the months of November & December 2015. During the month of November 2015, total 139 Nos. of fishes were caught which comprised of Yellow fin tuna & Lancet fish (21.9% each), Sword fish (14.6%), Dolphin fish (13.14%) and Sharks (12.4%). The aggregate hooking rate of 1.50% and Yellow fin tuna hooking rate of 0.32% from the area of Lat. 9°N-14°N was observed.

Whereas during the month of December 2015, the vessel operated in the area between Lat. 18°N- 22°N. The hooking rate increased to 1.62% with YFT hooking rate of 0.39% in comparison of the month of November 2015. Total 154 Nos. of fishes were hooked which consisted of Yellow fin tuna (24.0%), Shark (31.2%), Dolphin fish (28.6%), Blue Marlin (3.3%), Sword fish (2.0%) and others (11.0%). A sword fish (*Xiphias gladius*) weighing 170 Kg and a Blue Marlin weighing 140 Kg were recorded from the area of Lat. 20°N/Long. 66°E on 23/12/2015. The catches during the above two months were encouraging after a lapse of several years.

### **Record of King Fish in Oceanic waters**

King Fish *Rachycentron canadum* was reported from oceanic waters in the catches of *Matsya Vrushti* monofilament tuna longline during the months of November & December 2015. During Nov'15, *R. canadum* was caught (weighing 1.5 kg) from a depth range of 3340-3650 m in the area of Lat. 11°N/Long. 70°E on 27/11/2015 and during Dec'15 it was

recorded from the depth range of 2140-2300 m in the area of Lat. 18°N/Long 69°E.

King Fishes are mainly pelagic but may occur through out the water column (Freman & Walford 1976) and have taken at a depth of 50m and over water as deep as 1200 m (Springer & Bullies 1956). So far King fish was not recorded in a depth range of above 2000m. Fishery Survey of India has reported the occurrence of Cobia in above 2000 m depth in Indian Waters.

### Spadenose Shark abundance off Veraval (Gujarat coast), which is near threatened

During the month of November 2015 *M.V. Matsya Nireekshani*, the fishing vessel attached to the Mumbai Base of Fishery Survey of India was in survey operation between the area 20-21°N(North West coast). While carrying out the fishery resources survey operation in between the area 20°12/71°04 – 20°54/69°22, at the depth range 48-74m, totally 90 numbers of Spadenose Shark *(Scoliodon laticaudus*, Muller&Henle, 1838) were caught by using bottom trawl from 7 sampling stations.

All 90 specimen were studied taking certain aspects like length frequency, length weight, maturity, feeding intensity etc., whereas the length of the specimen caught was minimum 20.0cm and maximum 61.5cm., the weight 160gm – 780gm. during the month, shark maturity was observed 50% from stage I and 50 from II. Male and female were observed like 70/30 percentage respectively. When cut opening the umbilical sac of two female sharks, it is noted 5 pups from one sample and 9 pups in second sample. It was in the size group 12-14cm, weighed 10-15gm. The gut content analysis showed, 3 of the specimen infected with parasite tapeworm.

The abundance even observed throughout the year in the North West coast, due to low fecundity it is resilient to fishing pressure than other sharks. Now, this harmless shark is assessed by the international union for conservation of nature (IUCN,2010) as near threatened.

# RICH GROUND OF TUNA RESOURCES LOCATED OFF NAGAYALANKA AND MACHILLIPATNAM COAST.

During the month of December, 2015 the vessel Matsya Drushti carried out exploratory survey in the Central- East Coast of Bay of Bengal in between 14°N to 18°N by deploying Monofilament long line gear. Total No. of 61 fishes weighing about 1060 kg was caught during the voyage. A total 46 Nos. weighing 992 Kg of Yellow fin Tuna followed by Barracuda (03 Nos. weighing 12 Kg), Blue Marlin (01 No weighing 48 Kg), Skipjack Tuna (01 No weighing 06 Kg) and Dolphin Fish (01 No. weighing 02 Kg) among the commercial fish varieties were caught during the month under report. The size range of Yellow fin tuna was varying between Fork Length- 68 cm to 156 cm and weighing between 7 to 60 Kg. From the total catch, the Yellowfin tuna is 75% by numbers and 94 % by weight. The area observed to be productive as numbers of Yellow Fin Tuna shoals were observed which may be due to the influx of Godavari River water. The upwelling of coastal waters might have been enriched with the secondary productivity which is the reason of Tuna congregation. The gonad studies indicate that female and male tunas are either immature or in the maturing stage. The gut content analysis indicates that squid is the preferred food item by tunas.

An exhibition was also organized for the benefit of fishermen from Nimbudala Ranagt Bay, Yerrata, Kasturi Nagar and Bhishnupur, Middle Andaman.

A one day trip at sea was made on 30 July 2015 onboard *MFV Blue Marlin*, accessed the training imparted to fishermen in coordination with Doordarshan and All India Radio, Port Blair along with Director of Fisheries, Andaman & Nicobar Administration, Officer-in-charge, FSI Port Blair and two Scientists of the Port Blair Base.

#### **Obituary**

### (Dr. V.S. Somavanshi - 21.05.1949 - 17.09.2015)

Dr. V. S. Somavanshi Former Director General of Fishery Survey of India breathed his last in his hometown Latur,



Maharashtra on 17 September 2015. Dr. Somavanshi retired from Govt. Service in May 2009 after serving long innings with the Fishery Survey of India. Dr. Somavanshi was serving extensive for the last 13 years as Director General of the prestigious fisheries Institution of the country. His contribution to our

knowledge of the fishery resources in the Indian Exclusive Economic Zone are highly significant. As an accomplished Fisheries Scientist, Dr. Somavanshi loved his subject and was often passionate about the development of off-shore fisheries in the country. He represented India in many international meetings and organizations, in particularly the Indian Ocean Tuna Commission from its very inception the mid-nineties. From 2004-2009, Dr Somavanshi represented FSI in the Technical Advisory Council of the BOBP-IGO and helped to shape the work of the new IGO.
